Abstract

The papers of artist, author, activist, and educator Faith Ringgold consist of books, binders of artwork, and primary source material that date from 1948-2016. The Faith Ringgold Study Room Collection is organized into 21 series, which Ringgold denotes as "galleries." The 21 galleries fall into five larger categories: Works on Canvas (Galleries 1a-4), Works on Paper (Galleries 5-8), Works in Sculpture and Performance (Galleries 9-12), Works in Editions (Galleries 13-16), and Archives (Galleries 17-21). Galleries 1a-16 feature binders containing images of Ringgold's artwork in various mediums such as paintings on canvas and paper, quilts, dolls, and posters. Galleries 17a-21 consist of her archives, which include: books and writings by or about Faith Ringgold, exhibition catalogues, reviews, and resume items. Also found in the collection are sketches of art, correspondence, periodicals, scripts, early drafts of books and children's stories, photos, speeches, notes, documentation of awards and honorary doctorates, interview transcripts, activist material, and other ephemera.

Administrative Information

Acquisition Information

The Faith Ringgold Study Room Collection was donated to the David C. Driskell Center by Faith Ringgold. All of the materials were transferred to the Center in 2016. The materials were then surveyed and inventoried. Some of the non-primary source materials were numbered and organized into the 21 galleries by Faith Ringgold. The remaining non-primary source material was numbered following Ringgold's system and then organized into 21 galleries (see the Arrangement section of the finding aid for more information on how materials were arranged). Materials were acquired by the Driskell Center in four batches: the first and largest acquisition arrived in June 2016 and contained most of the books and archival material that are included in Galleries 1-4, 9-12, and 17. The second transfer arrived in August 2016 and included books that are included in Galleries 18-21. The third transfer arrived in October 2016 and included books that are included in Galleries 5, 7, 8, 13-16. The final transfer arrived in November 2016 and included books that are included in Galleries 6, 15, and 20.

Processing Information

The processing for this collection took place between the end of 2015 through the beginning of 2017. From November 2015-March 2016, the collection was inventoried at Faith Ringgold's home by the Archivist Stephanie Smith. The collection was then moved to the Driskell Center in June 2016. Based on Faith Ringgold's original organization, all items were inventoried and processed into galleries and sub-galleries. Items in the collection such as books, exhibition catalogues, and pages from binders are processed at the item level. Primary source material is processed at the folder level. All information regarding each item is included in the Driskell Center's PastPerfect database. This work was completed by the Research Assistant Raymond Williams.

While processing the Faith Ringgold Study Room Collection, paper materials were rehoused into acid-free folders, the materials arranged into chronological order within each folder, and rusty staples and paperclips were removed if deemed necessary. Completed folders were placed within acid-free Hollinger boxes.

Separated Materials

The materials from the Faith Ringgold Study Room Collection are kept in the Faith Ringgold Study Room at the David C. Driskell Center. Materials that are oversized or restricted in some way have been separated from the collection and housed in an oversize

box adjacent to the main collection. Several over-large posters are stored in the Driskell Center's vault in flat filing.

Biographical Information

Faith Ringgold, painter, writer, speaker, mixed media sculptor, performance artist, educator and activist lives and works in Englewood, New Jersey. Ms. Ringgold is professor emeritus at the University of California, San Diego where she taught art from 1984 until 2002.

Professor Ringgold is the recipient of more than 75 awards including 23 Honorary Doctor of Fine Arts Degrees. She has received fellowships and grants that include the National Endowment For the Arts Award for sculpture (1978) and for painting (1989); The La Napoule Foundation Award for painting in France (1990); The John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation Fellowship for painting (1987); The New York Foundation For the Arts Award for painting (1988); The American Association of University Women for travel to Africa (1976); The Creative Artists Public Service Award for painting (1971).

Ringgold's art has been exhibited in museums and galleries in the USA, Europe, Asia, South America, the Middle East, and Africa. Her art is included in many private and public art collections including The Metropolitan Museum of Art, The National Museum of American Art, The Museum of Modern Art, The Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, The Boston Museum of Fine Art, The Chase Manhattan Bank Collection, The Baltimore Museum, Williams College Museum of Art, The High Museum of Fine Art, The Newark Museum, The Phillip Morris Collection, The St. Louis Art Museum and The Spencer Museum. Ms. Ringgold is represented by ACA Gallery in New York City.

Ringgold's recent painting series includes The American Collection (1997); a series of painted story quilts in which Ringgold undertakes to rewrite African American art history. This series is an extension of Ringgold's French Collection, which she began in Paris and the South of France in 1990. Many of these works were included in a traveling exhibition curated by The New Museum of Contemporary Art titled, Faith Ringgold: Dancing at the Louvre and Other Story Quilts (catalog). The theme of freedom and resilience are the common thread that runs through the Coming to Jones Road Series part 1(1999-2000). In this series, images of escaped slaves are moving through distant and colorful landscapes to a newfound freedom and home.

Ringgold's public commissions include Flying Home: Harlem Heroes and Heroines, two 25 foot mosaic murals installed on the uptown and downtown platforms of the 125th street Independent Rapid Transit (7th Avenue IRT) Subway station in New York City in 1996; The Crown Heights Children's Story Quilt featuring folklore from the 12 major cultures that

settled Crown Heights is installed in the library at PS 90 in Crown Heights, Brooklyn; Eugenio Maria de Hostos: A Man and His Dream, (1994) A mural celebrating the life of Eugenio Maria de Hostos for De Hostos Community College in the Bronx is installed in the atrium of the college.

Ringgold's first published book, the award winning, Tar Beach, "a book for children of all ages", was published by Random House in 1991 and has won more than 30 awards including, a Caldecott Honor and the Coretta Scott King award for the best illustrated children's book of 1991. The book, Tar Beach, is based on the story quilt Tar Beach, from Ringgold's The Woman On A Bridge Series of 1988 and is in the permanent collection of the Guggenheim Museum in New York City. HBO included an animated version of Tar Beach in "Good Night Moon and Other Sleepy Time Lullabies." This program runs periodically on HBO and has been released as a DVD.

Ringgold has written and illustrated a total of 18 children's books including the above mentioned Tar Beach, Aunt Harriet's Underground Railroad In The Sky, My Dream of Martin Luther King and Talking to Faith Ringgold, (an autobiographical interactive art book for children of all ages), The Invisible Princess, an original African American Fairy Tale based on the quilt Born in a Cotton Field, 1997 all published by Random House. Random House also released three books for pre-school age children: Counting to Tar Beach and Cassie's Colorful Day and Cassie's Word Quilt. Hyperion Books, a Walt Disney publisher has published Dinner at Aunt Connie's House (based on The Dinner Quilt, a painted story quilt Ringgold created in 1986) and Bonjour Lonnie. If a Bus Could Talk: The Story of Ms. Rosa Parks won the NAACP's Image Award 2000 and is available from Simon and Schuster. O Holy Night and The Three Witches and Harlem Renaissance Party are the newest books from Harper Collins. Knopf released her latest book, We Came to America in 2016. We Flew Over the Bridge: The Memoirs of Faith Ringgold, Ringgold's first adult book was published by Little, Brown in 1995 and has been re-released by Duke University Press.

Ms. Ringgold has a history of jurying and curating exhibitions. Ms. Ringgold juried the Mid Atlantic: Annual Juried Art Show for the Hoyt Institute of Fine Arts, PA (2006), the Appalachian Corridor Exhibition for the Avampato Discovery Museum in WV (2005), the 10th Annual National Art Competition at Truman State University in Kirksville, Missouri (1998) \$1,500 in prizes were awarded, the Texas National Exhibition titled Art for the Year 2000 at Stephen Austin College in Nacogdoches (1996) where three thousand entries

were submitted and \$4,500.00 in prizes were awarded. Ringgold curated the 25th anniversary exhibition of the Women's Caucus for Art International Exhibition held in Chicago, February 1997. Ms. Ringgold supports the talent, effort, dedication and creativity of emerging artists.

Scope and Contents

The papers of artist, author, activist, and educator Faith Ringgold consist of books, binders of artwork, and primary source material that date from 1948-2016. The papers focus on her body of work in various art mediums ranging from works on canvas, paper, sculpture and performance, editions, and games. The largest portion of her papers consists of the archives, which contain books and other writings by or about Ringgold, exhibition catalogues, reviews, and resume items.

The Faith Ringgold Study Room Collection is organized into 21 series, which Ringgold denotes as "galleries." The records are organized based on Faith Ringgold's original order, and materials that were unorganized by Ringgold were inventoried and arranged by Driskell Center staff to fall into Ringgold's organizational schema. The 21 galleries fall into five larger categories: Works on Canvas (Galleries 1a-4), Works on Paper (Galleries 5-8), Works in Sculpture and Performance (Galleries 9-12), Works in Editions (Galleries 13-16), and Archives (Galleries 17-21). Galleries 1a-16 feature binders containing images of Ringgold's artwork in various mediums. Ringgold compiled these binders; they provide a visual history of her career as an artist. Some galleries between 1a-16 also include primary source material associated with images or the medium of the gallery. Galleries 17a-21 consist of her archives, which include: books and writings by or about Faith Ringgold, exhibition catalogues, reviews, and primary source materials such as letters, sketches, and ephemera.

The 21 galleries are, in order of their arrangement: Paintings (on canvas), Tankas, Quilts, Quilt Editions, Paintings (on paper), Illustrations, Studies, Drawings, Dolls, Soft Sculpture, Masks, Performance, Posters, Prints, Artists' Books and Self-Published Books, Games, Books by and/or about Faith Ringgold, Writings, Exhibition Catalogues, Reviews, and All About Faith Ringgold.

The first four galleries (Galleries 1a-4) fall into the category of Ringgold's "Works on Canvas," broken down into the following media: Paintings (1948-2012), Tankas (1972-2010), Quilts (1980-2010), and Quilt Editions (1990-2014). The Paintings gallery is divided into two separate galleries: Early Works (1948-1968) and Paintings (1963-2012).

Researchers will find correspondence, sketches of quilts, notecard folios, and other ephemera in the Paintings, Quilts, and Quilt Editions galleries.

The next four galleries (Galleries 5-8) fall into the category of Ringgold's "Works on Paper" broken down into the following media: Paintings (1971-2012), Illustrations (1991-2015), Studies (1990-2009), and Drawings (1966-2014). Researchers will find brochures, images, sketches, and other ephemera in the Paintings and Drawings galleries.

The next four galleries (Galleries 9-12) consist of Ringgold's "Works in Sculpture and Performance" divided into the following media: Dolls (1973-1986), Soft Sculptures (1974-2007), Masks (1973-1985), and Performance (1975-1991). Researchers will find images, news articles, scripts, and other ephemera in the Dolls and Performance galleries.

The next four galleries (Galleries 13-16) fall into the category "Works in Editions" and include the following media: Posters (1970-2012), Prints (1970-2014), Artists Books and Self-Published Books (1970-2012), and Games (2008-2013). Researchers will find correspondence, print drafts, notes, playing card designs, order forms and other ephemera in the Prints and Games galleries.

The remaining five galleries (Galleries 17-21) consist of Ringgold's archives. The gallery Books By and/or about Faith Ringgold is the largest and it is split into four sub-galleries: Books by Faith Ringgold—Children's; Books by Faith Ringgold—Adult; Books About Faith Ringgold; and Books by Faith Ringgold—Self-published. The sub-galleries Books by Faith Ringgold—Children's contains a copy of every children's book written by Faith Ringgold including her first, *Tar Beach*. The gallery also contains drafts of children's stories/books, and other ephemera related to the books. The sub-galleries Books by Faith Ringgold—Adult contains copies of the first and second editions of her memoir *We Flew Over The Bridge* and her most recent book *A Letter To My Daughter*, Michele Wallace, in response to her book, *Black Macho and the Myth of the Superwoman*. This sub-series also contains early drafts or galley copies of both books. The sub-galleries Books about Faith Ringgold contains the bulk of the collection, containing 300 books, magazine articles, and other publications about Faith Ringgold which were published from 1967-2016. Researchers will find articles, photos, early drafts of books, and other ephemera. The sub-galleries Books by Faith Ringgold—Self-published contains copies of *The French Collection*, *Coming to Jones Road* (Second Edition), and *Coming to Jones Road Part II*. Researchers will also find early drafts of *The French Collection*.

Writings (Gallery 18) contains a collection of writings by Faith Ringgold in various publications and mediums from 1969-2012. The gallery contains stories, song lyrics, story quilt texts, speeches, essays, drafts, notes, and research.

Exhibition Catalogues (Gallery 19) contains 230 exhibition catalogues that feature Faith Ringgold's artwork from 1968-2016. Exhibition catalogues include solo exhibitions focused on Ringgold as well as group exhibitions in which one or more of her pieces were included. Researchers will also find clippings and ephemera of various exhibitions including notable exhibitions such as *The Artist & the Quilt* and *Faith Ringgold: Twenty Years of Painting, Sculpture and Performance* (1963-1983).

Reviews (Gallery 20) is a collection of reviews about Faith Ringgold and her artistic career from 1972-2016. Items include magazines, newspaper clippings, and collections of reviews put together by Faith Ringgold.

All About Faith Ringgold (Gallery 21) contains numerous items about Ringgold's life and career from 1964-2016. Researchers will find numerous items, some of which include documentation of awards and honorary doctorates that she has received; chronologies and short biographies of her life; transcripts of interviews that she has given; material related to her activist role in groups that she helped create or was a part of (most notably, the Judson 3); and correspondence from fans, publishers, and personal acquaintances.

Arrangement

The collection is arranged into 21 galleries. These galleries are informed by the way that Faith Ringgold envisioned it. The first 16 galleries feature a binder or binders for each gallery, that sit in magazine holders, and display images of Ringgold's artwork in various mediums and are arranged in chronological order. Most of the 16 galleries contain primary source materials, which are located on a shelf below the magazine holder and are arranged chronologically by folder title and then chronologically within each folder. The remaining five galleries are located on a bookshelf and feature books followed by primary source for each gallery. The books in each gallery are arranged first by the artist's numbering system and then the remaining books in the gallery continue with her numbering but are arranged chronologically. The primary source materials within these galleries are either arranged chronologically or alphabetically by folder title and then chronologically within each folder.

Researchers interested in seeing early drafts of "Who's Afraid of Aunt Jemima?" should examine the archival folder associated with this work. Researchers may also find the archival material for "The Dinner Quilt" interesting. In it the researcher will find images and background research on some of the figures featured on the quilt such as Dorothy Dandridge, Bessie Smith, Mary McLeod Bethune, Augusta Savage, Zora Neale Hurston, Marian Anderson, and Madame CJ Walker who were also used in her book "Dinner At Aunt Connie's House." The series also contains an early draft of the text of the story quilt "Tar Beach."

Gallery 21: All About Faith Ringgold, 1964-2016 (68 books; 7 boxes; 5 VHSSes; 3 DVDs; 1 CD)

This gallery contains items about Faith Ringgold's life and career from 1964-2016. Archival items in this series include some of the following: awards, honors and honorary doctorates that Ringgold received; biographical information such as chronologies/resumes and short biographies; lectures and interviews she has given; and correspondence from her fans, publishers, and personal acquaintances. Highlights include correspondence, publicity, foreign propaganda, legal documents and petitions related to the Judson 3 trial. In 1970, Ringgold was one of the three artists (along with Jean Toche and Jon Hendricks), who were arrested and charged for desecrating the American flag in 1970 at The People's Flag Show exhibition held at Judson Memorial Church. The three artists became known as the Judson 3. The Judson 3 were found guilty and were given the option to serve one month in prison or pay a \$100 fine. All three chose to pay the fine. The Flag Show and its aftermath is just one of many forms of activism that Ringgold has participated in in her lifetime. She has also been active in the feminist movement. This gallery contains documents of the groups that Ringgold was active in from 1981-1986. The gallery also contains records and ephemera of the awards that Ringgold received from 1976-2014,

honorary doctorates received from 1986-2008, honors received from 1981-2016, lectures given from 1971-2013, and a collection of video and sound recordings from 1995-2013.
